At the age of 16, **Mark Glentworth** was one of the youngest students to study percussion at the Royal Northern College of Music. After graduating, he started working in London as a freelance percussionist in all styles of music with artists including Steven Berkoff, Sir John Gielgud, Sir Peter Maxwell Davis on his *Fires of London*, the BBC Symphony Orchestra, and the London Sinfonietta. Mark's composition work ranges from commercial song writing to orchestral composition and opera, and he is the composer of the world-famous *Blues for Gilbert* - the most performed, recorded and studied solo tuned percussion piece of all time.

Director **Julia Stubbs** has recently directed the premiere of *Still Here* by Mari Lloyd ( $\star\star\star\star\star$  Jack Studio Theatre); other credits include Anne Bertreau's solo play with music *A Voice* ( $\star\star\star\star$  Brighton Fringe & Edinburgh Fringe); and the Off-West End transfer of Steven Hevey's debut play *In My Name* (Trafalgar Studios) named One of FIVE BEST PLAYS in London by the Evening Standard.
